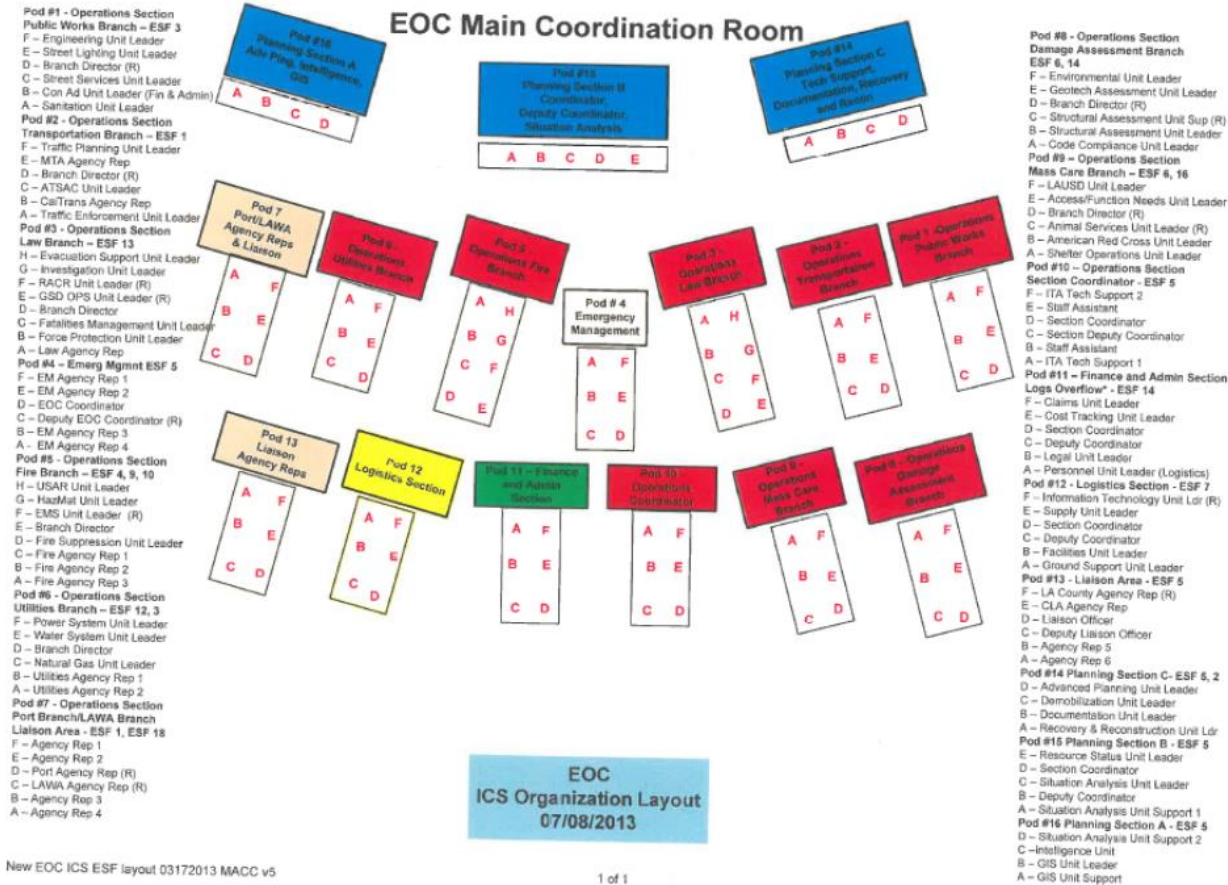

# Operations to Recovery (\$\$)

- While the EOC is activated, cost information is gathered
- Once the EOC is deactivated, financial recovery is transitioned to the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO)
  - Preliminary cost estimates are gathered city-wide for Initial Damage Estimates (IDE)
  - IDE sent to the County
  - Determination made is made to further public assistance efforts

# Public Assistance Funds

## **Federal Declaration**

- FEMA 75%
- State (CDAA) is 18.75%
- City 6.25%
- Hazard Mitigation Grant Opportunity
  - Section 404 Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

## **State Proclamation Only (CDAA) (no federal declaration)**

- State 75%
- City 25%

# Documenting Damages

- Document damages
  - Who / What / When / Where / Why / How
  - What is the scope of work to bring back to pre-disaster condition
- Tracking Personnel Time
  - Use of work order numbers for personnel time used to respond to incident
  - Use of personnel time to recover from incident

# Charter and LAAC provisions

- Charter Section 231 (i).
  - The Mayor shall have the power and duty to declare a local emergency and coordinate the City's emergency response activities
- LAAC
  - Div 8, Chapter 3 Local Emergencies
  - Div 9, Chapter 1, Sec 9.3 Emergency Purchasing
